To Pass:	1. A candidate must have minimum of 80% attendance (irrespective of the kind of absence) in theory and practical in
	each course/subject for appearing for examination.

- 2. Minimum pass marks shall be 50% in each of the Theory and practical papers Internal and External examination separately except in English.
- 3. *ENG (UM01CENG01) College Exam, marks are not added for calculating SGPA, Pass mark-40%
- 4. The student has to pass in all mandatory modules placed within courses and the pass mark for each module is 50% (C Grade).
- 5. If a candidate fails in either theory or practical, he/she has to re-appear for both the papers (Theory and Practical.
- 6. Assessment guidelines based on grading of performance. Each student shall be awarded a final grade at the end of the semester for each course. Absolute grading is used by converting the marks to grade, based on predetermined class interval.
- 7. UGC 10 point grading system is used with pass grade modified.
- 8. A Candidate must have 100% attendance in each of the practical areas before award of degree.

ASSESSMENT GUIDELINES

1. Grading of Performance

Based on the performance, each student shall be awarded a final grade at the end of the semester for each course.

Absolute grading is used by converting the marks to grade, based on predetermined class intervals.

UGC 10 point grading system is used with pass grade modified.

- > For Nursing Courses and all other courses Pass is at C Grade (5 grade point) 50% and above
- For English and electives Pass is at P Grade (4 grade point) 40% and above

Computation of Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) and Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA)

SPGA is the weighted average of the grade points obtained in all courses by the student during the semester

(All courses excluding English and electives)

Ex. SGPA Computation

$$SGPA = \frac{C1G1 + C2G2 + C3G3}{C1 + C2 + C3}$$

$$= \frac{70}{10} = 7 \text{ (rounded off to two decimal points)}$$



Computation of CGPA

- CGPA is calculated with SGPA of all semesters to two decimal points and is indicated in final grade in mark card/transcript showing grades of all 8 semesters and their courses/subjects.
- > CGPA reflects the failed status in case of fail till the course/s is passed.
